

English language tests and certificates that are sufficient for admission to a degree programme requiring level B2 (according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages):

- English Abitur (A-level examination in English, with a minimum grade of 4)
It is irrelevant whether it is a subject-specific Abitur or a general university entrance qualification (see GSO §61)
- English studied up to the Abitur; the Abitur certificate must show a minimum of 4 marks;

for an Abitur taken in Germany, proof of completion of upper secondary education is sufficient. For foreign qualifications, 8 years of English study must have been completed.
- Successful completion of an English-language degree programme
- TOEFL iBT with a score of at least 4
- TOEFL ITP with a score of at least 543
- IELTS (International English Language Testing System)
- Cambridge FCE
- Cambridge ESOL Level 1 (= Level B2 according to the CEFR)
- MOTET (Mondiale Online Technical English Test)
- MOTET (General Technical English Module)
- Unicert II
- LCCI (Business Certificate) – Level 3 (= B2 + C1) required
- Level subdivisions – e.g. **B 2.1./ B2.2.** – both are sufficient for admission
- PTE Academic (Level B2)

If you require English language proficiency at Level B2 (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) to commence a degree programme, you must provide evidence of these English language skills. Acceptable forms of evidence include:

- TOEFL iBT minimum score of 4
- TOEFL ITP minimum 543 points
- IELTS (International English Language Testing System)
- Cambridge FCE
- Cambridge ESOL Level 1 (= Level B2 CEFR)
- MOTET (Mondiale Online Technical English Test)
- MOTET (General Technical English Module)
- Unicert II
- LCCI (Business Certificate) – Level 3 (= B2 + C1) required
- First study course in English

There is no difference between Level B2.1 and B2.2.
